12th Annual Heartland Forage Day Set For Feb. 21

he 12th Annual Heartland Forage Day has been scheduled for Thursday, Feb. 21, at the St. Maurus Catholic Church Hall in Biehle. MO.

The forage day is hosted by the Southeast Missouri Forage and Grassland Council, a not-for-profit organization promoting efficient and profitable forage-animal agriculture. Also assisting as hosts are the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), University of Missouri Outreach and Extension (UOE) and Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC).

Doors will open for registration at 5:30 p.m. and the meal will be served at 6 p.m. The presentations will begin at 7 pm and conclude by 9 p.m.
