

2010 Winter Wheat Workshop – Dealing With Uncertainties

Farmers and agriculture dealers in northern Illinois should mark their calendar for the “2010 Winter Wheat Workshop – Dealing with Uncertainties” on February 12. The program is from 9:30 am to Noon and will be delivered via teleconference at participating University of Illinois Extension offices. Registration begins at 9:00 am.

The program, designed for wheat production in northern Illinois, will focus on the implications and alternatives of delayed seeding. Also addressed will be disease management and variety selection strategies.

Specific topics include delayed seeding-will it survive, disease management strategies-a review of 2009 and outlook for 2010, and wheat variety selection-current choices and what's

ahead. Also discussed will be the feasibility of growing spring wheat in 2010, and growing your nitrogen by seeding red clover in winter wheat.

Leading the discussion will be Emerson Nafziger and Carl Bradley, University of Illinois Extension specialists in the Department of Crop Sciences, and Jim Morrison, Extension crops educator.

Continuing education units for Certified Crop Advisers have been requested. The program is sponsored by University of Illinois Extension.
