2011 Version Of Arkansas DD50 Is Ready

he 2011 version of the Arkansas Rice DD50 program is ready to help growers time critical production activities, said Stewart Runsick, extension area agronomist for the University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture.

"The program will predict the timing of more than two dozen production practices based on growth stage, including herbicide and nitrogen application, as well as critical times to scout and spray for insects and diseases," he said. "The program helps growers and consultants be more efficient in scouting and more timely with treatments."

"Because DD50 is browser based, producers can run DD50 from their home or office or even

their smart phone," Runsick said.
