The forum featured three nationally respected speakers:

Dr. Katharine Hayhoe is a climate scientist from Texas Tech University. Producers will be interested to know that she and her husband wrote a wonderful book entitled, A Climate for Change, Global Warming Facts for Faith-Based Decisions. At the UK forum, she gave an excellent talk on the science of climate change. However, perhaps more importantly, Dr. Hayhoe also spoke about how climate change relates to her values, which are anchored in her faith.

The second speaker was retired Brigadier General Steven M. Anderson, a man with 31 years of service to our country. He spoke about how climate change presents numerous challenges to our national security. He also spoke about the risks our troops face based on our current energy system.

Our final speaker was Rep. Bob Inglis, previously a Republican Congressman from South Carolina and currently the Director of the Energy and Enterprise Initiative. Rep. Inglis surprised many people by presenting solutions to climate change that fit well with principles of free enterprise.
