Farm consultant Bob Pearson has attended numerous Agronomy Days and said he gets a lot out of the event. "The professional staff at the individual tour stops have hands-on experience and are able to answer the hard questions," said Pearson. Networking with other farmers is another advantage, according to Pearson. "People attend from all over the state and comments made at the stops and during lunch give added insight and value to the day."

This year's tours will include research findings on controlling waterhemp and other weeds; soybean varieties that are resistant to soybean aphids; and management of western corn rootworm. "In addition to the free tours to field test sites, there will be tent displays from agricultural organizations, research projects, and vendors," Dunker said.

Callahan is a graduate of the University of Illinois with a degree in agricultural communications. She became the first woman agribusiness director for WMBD Radio and TV in Peoria.
