Our Armor and Delta King line-ups have truly been put through some tough evaluations. While it hasn't been easy, we know that kind of scrutiny builds growers' confidence in our reliability as a seed company. The greatest feature of our 2011 line-up may be the fact that all of our releasable lines for 2011 have undergone testing and in-field experience.

As you may know, our company's seed is conveniently split under two separate names reflecting soil type. Our 'Delta King' line-up will be suited for heavy soils and our beans made for sandy-silt loam soils will be labeled under the 'Armor' line.

Our line-up for 2011 will be featuring a few new RR2 lines and offering some of our most dependable previous lines.

This year, our available RR2 lines will be Delta King 4440 Delta King 4744 Armor 47-R33, Armor 48-R40.

• Delta King 4440 R2 will capture the early- to mid-group 4 market. It offers excellent height for heavy soil and held up well this season in the heat. In side-by-side comparisons to leading competitors it is moving the yield and consistency meter.

• Armor 47-R3 R2 has looked great this year. It was the leading R2 variety last season and we expect it to perform well again this season. It will be isolated to the sandy-silt loam soils. This variety requires a high level of management to get the best performance.

• Delta King 4744 will be one of the leaders in yield performance in plot or on the farm. This line works well across all areas, offers an STS trail and good standability.

• Armor 48-R40 R2 looks great on sandy-silt

loam soils with good standability. It has been a proven yielder in all areas.

We would be remiss to discuss our new line without mentioning our tried and true varieties, all part of our 2011 line-up still setting the bar high.

• Armor 42-M1 has had a great year. It has been placed on many different type soils and different type irrigation systems and has held up well. Its quality has been a big advantage and the yield has been great. It offers a good disease package on Cyst and some moderate Root Knot.

• Armor 47-F8 will still be valued on sandy to silt loam soils. It holds a moderate height on aggressive soils and can be put under high or moderate management.

• Delta King 4968 works very well on heavy soil. This bean has always had a great field appearance with a clean tan pod. Yield and emergence set this variety apart from other 4.9's.

• Armor 53-Z5 is proven on silt loam and aggressive growing soil. With its excellent disease package and resistance to Stem Canker, it has produced consistent yields across all areas. 53-Z5 has tested as an excluder in chloride testing

• Delta King 5363 and Delta King GP 533 are built for your heavy soils. These varieties offer a medium/tall plant type with a tawny on brown appearance. Kept on heavy soils, they offer excellent tolerance to stem canker. Both lines have been tested as excluders on chloride soils.

• Armor 55-A5 will be a very defensive mid-5. Its clear advantages are its tolerance to Root Knot and the excluder trait. It has a shorter plant type and will need to be positioned on sandy-silt loam soils.
