Donny Carpenter of Texas - 300 Bushel Corn Club member who averages over 200 bpa on his 5000 acre farming operation, Steve Albracht of Texas-multi time, multi class National NCGA yield contest winner, David Hula of New York-reigning overall NCGA champion with a yield of 429.02 bpa and Doug Porter of Missouri - who implemented the ideas he learned from this approach 6 years ago and has beaten his county soybean average by 61 percent and his county corn average by 55 percent the last 3 years; while simultaneously increasing his bottom line and buying another 300 acres of farm ground. Rod Livesay of Iowa - will emcee the event. Livesay has presented over 500 state and national NCGA awards to farmers whom he works with since he began working with the yield contest about 15 years ago. He has team members all across the corn belt, and as far away as North Carolina and Wyoming. Livesay's goal for the event is that each attendee will take home new ideas that will add 15 bushels to their yield next growing season.
