This two-day University of Illinois Extension conference is designed to address a wide array of crop production and pest management issues in a format that provides time for in-depth discussion and interaction between participants and the researchers.

Topics include fungicide research on corn, soybean and wheat; an update on Japanese beetle and soybean aphid; saturation and flood-

ing effects on soils; cover crop management; corn nematode identification and management; soil fertility; effect of crop rotation on yield; population, stand uniformity and row spacing effects on corn yield; wheat fertility management; water quality update; and much more.
