

# Cullers Breaks Soybean Yield Record For Third Time

## Cullers One Of 121 Speakers

At 14th Annual National Conservation Systems Cotton & Rice Conference

**“K**ip Cullers excels in soybean and corn production. He is a member of the 100 Club (soybeans) and the 300 Club (corn). He has raised the yield bar for soybeans and has won 13 National Corn Grower Association awards,” said John LaRose, Steering Committee Chairman of the National Conservation Systems Cotton & Rice Conference (NCSCRC), Southern Corn & Soybean Conference and Precision Ag Conference.

“We are excited to have Cullers as a speaker at the upcoming conference,” added LaRose. Cullers will be presenting two Breakout Sessions and a Round Table discussion during the 14th Annual National Conservation Systems Cotton & Rice Conference in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, February 1-2, 2011.

“It is outstanding that Cullers has broken the world record soybean yield three times; 160.6 bushels in 2010, but it is equally outstanding that this year Cullers’ total farm soybean yield average is 109 bushel per acre,” said LaRose.

Since 2005 Cullers has annually entered the NCGA yield contest. Each year since 2005 Cullers entry has been a yield in excess of 300 bushel of corn per acre. His highest entry of 347.27 bushel was in 2006. “Farmers attending the conference will have the opportunity to learn about his intensive management practices,” said LaRose.

Cullers has spoken at past NCSCRC conferences. “Cullers is a popular speaker at our conferences. I expect his breakout sessions at the 2011 conference to be standing room only. At past conferences his round table discussions have generated impressive interaction between attendees. In fact, attendees swarm around him

as he eagerly shares his agriculture production knowledge,” stated LaRose

Cullers is a diversified farmer. Currently Cullers farms over 10,000 acres. He grows corn, soybeans, and green beans; greens such as spinach, collard, kale, mustard and turnip along with beef, hay and poultry.
