**C** hoices was the main topic at the recent Pioneer Hi-Bred Field Day at Union City, Tenn. Lonnie Smith, Pioneer's business unit sales manager, explained the focus.

"The wonderful thing about today is it gives us an opportunity to visit with growers about something that's critically important to them," he said.
