llinois agriculture continued its roller coaster ride during 2009, with more dips than rises. A major issue was the impact of the sharpest global recession since WWII, which depressed demand and prices across the sector.

Combined with rising input prices, planting delays, and H1N1 fears, this was a year of tremendous uncertainty by any standard.

In 2010, there is the possibility of better times due to recovery in the general economy and some lessened pressures on the cost side. However, this makes the need for sound economic information and analysis even more critical.
