Receipts: 555; Last Week: 766; Year Ago: 428

Compared to last week, steers and heifers sold \$1-5 higher. Slaughter cows sold steady and bulls sold \$2 lower; Demand good and supply light. Cows made up approximately 20 percent of the run, 80 percent feeders. Steers made up approximately 54 percent of the offering, 44 percent heifers. Offerings over 600 lbs totaled around 19 percent.

350-400 lbs \$92-96.50; few 400-500 lbs \$85-95.50; 500-575 lbs \$80-92.50.

FEEDER BULLS: Medium and Large 1-2: Few 550-575 lbs \$88-95.50.

BREEDING BULLS: Medium and Large 1-2: Few 1-3 yr old from Reg. Herd 1050-2120 lbs \$925-2,100 per head.

SLAUGHTER COWS: Breaking 75-80 Percent Lean, few \$46.50-47, High Dressing \$51; Boning 80-85 Percent Lean, \$45.25-48.75, High Dressing few \$52.50, Low Dressing \$43.50; Lean 85-90 Percent Lean, \$40-43, Low Dressing \$35.

SLAUGHTER BULLS: Yield Grade 1-2: Few 1390-2385 lbs, bulk \$56.50-58.50, High Dressing \$60.

STOCKER COWS: Scarce.

REPLACEMENT COWS: Medium and Large 1-2: 4-7 yrs old, 890-1320 lbs 2nd and 3rd stage, \$810-850. Few 8 yrs to short and solid mouth, 840-1255 lbs, 2nd and 3rd stage, \$485-560.

COW-CALF PAIRS: Medium and Large 1-2: Few 4-7 yrs old, 1070-1285 lbs with 80-150 lbs calves, \$760-950. Δ
