From Highway 61 South, the ride will proceed to Smith St., Ridge Drive and Independence Drive, then to Perry County Nursing Home. After a right turn onto Highway 61, the ride will continue to Highway 51 Bypass, turning left to the first rest stop at Richardet Farms, before proceeding to PCR 710. The ride proceeds right on 710, another right onto State Route CC to State Route T for a noon meal at Silver Lake Grove. After lunch, the ride continues on State Route T to turn left on State Route N, where it proceeds to PCR 810. From 810 it's on to PCR 806 then to State Route M, crossing I-55 and turning right onto PCR 814 for threequarter mile for a right turn onto Shady Lane. An afternoon stop will be near Brewer Church, then across Highway 61 to State Route M to travel to PCR 906. Turn right on 906 to State Route V, then cross Highway 61 onto Sycamore Lane to return to Seminary Grounds. Δ
