wo tools to help Arkansas soybean producers make the best variety selections, the 2010 annual "Soybean Update" and the 2011 version of SOYVA, are now available.

Both are products of the University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture.

The annual "Soybean Update" publication details research data collected from the division's Soybean Variety Testing Program. The updates are separated into "Early Season Roundup Ready," "Full-Season Roundup Ready," and "Full-Season Non-Roundup Ready," which includes conventional and LibertyLink cultivars, said Jeremy Ross, extension soybean agronomist for the University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture.

Useful data in "Soybean Update" includes yields, disease ratings, agronomic characteristics, herbicide tolerance and more. These publications provide growers with current varietal performance and characteristic data to aid in

their variety selections.
