heat management, wheat variety selection and oat variety selection will be presented in depth at a Small Grains Program on Thursday, June 25, beginning at 5:30 pm. The program will be held at the University of Illinois Northern Illinois Agronomy Research Center, located near Shabbona, Illinois. Dr. Fred Kolb, University of Illinois oat and wheat breeder, will discuss varieties that are available for northern Illinois. Dr. Emerson Nafziger, U of I Extension Crops Specialist, will present information on best management practices and current techniques for small grain management. Carl Bradley, U of I Extension Plant Pathologist, will discuss disease management in small grain production. The meeting will include inside sessions and an opportunity to view varieties in the yield trials and research trials focusing on different small grain management techniques at the Center.

The program is co-sponsored by the Illinois Wheat Association and University of Illinois Extension. IWA Board member, Dennis Rehn, will be preparing a grilled pork chop sandwich meal to start the program. There will be a \$5.00/person charge for the meal.
