Producers and crop consultants can go to the UM IPM web site to monitor the moth catches of destructive crop insects in Southeast Missouri. We have moth traps in 5 counties in SEMO including Scott. The insects we are monitoring are black cutworm, true armyworm, Japanese beetle, European corn borer, southwestern corn borer, corn earworm, tobacco budworm, fall armyworm, and beet armyworm.

At the web site, click on the picture or link of the insect pest to get the moth trap counts for the region/county for each month. You can also subscribe to receive email alerts when the moth catches reach critical levels. The web site has additional information on indentifying and scouting specific insects, IPM guides, publications, newsletters, and information on private and commercial pesticide training and exam dates. <http://ppp.missouri.edu/pestmonitoring/index.htm> Δ
