UT Institute Of Agriculture Hosts Tobacco, Beef And More Field Day

t's no surprise the focus of this field day will be beef and tobacco. Scheduled for June 25 at the University of Tennessee Highland Rim AgResearch and Education Center, *Tobacco*, *Beef and More* will highlight new research, management and production strategies for the re-

gion's tobacco and beef cattle producers. But as the name implies, this field day has more to offer. Visitors can also learn about a number of other topics, including crop and forage variety development and pesticide management issues.

Registration for *To-bacco*, *Beef and More* begins at 7:00 a.m. Field tours will begin

at 7:30 a.m. and end at approximately 12:30 p.m. Lunch will be provided and will feature a discussion on animal welfare issues facing live-stock production.

The highlight of *Tobacco*, *Beef and More* will be field tours aimed to enlighten producers on issues facing the featured commodities. Tobacco tours will focus on high-yielding and disease resistant variety developments, as well as the interaction of nitrogen rates and harvest timing. UT experts will also discuss the potential risk of using recently developed non-cropland and pasture herbicides near tobacco, and

herbicide miss-applications.

Beef cattle tours will cover animal health, successful vaccination programs and factors affecting a herd's reproductive success. Forage topics will explore new annual and perennial forage varieties under development, and the potential for grazing warm season grasses.

Also on the agenda, an overview of the Tennessee crop variety development program, as well as a session on managing herbicide resistant weeds in corn and soybeans.

Tobacco, Beef and More is a free event, and all are welcome to take part in this exciting exchange of information. The field day site is located 25
